Two-Day Training Workshop on "Healing Trauma through Arts"

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This training workshop introduce the conceptual foundation and therapeutic facilitation of Person-Centered Expressive Arts for healing psychosocial wounds and trauma. Content includes the working principles of applying arts in trauma recovery, emotional healing and personal transformation. This workshop is a practice-based professional training of multi-modal expressive arts to enhance counseling, group work and self-care. The arts modalities, including visual art, music, sounding, dramatic exercises, body movement, writing and mindfulness practice, will be integrated in the learning process.

Expressive arts are empowering tools for expression, catharsis, self-understanding, communication, actualization of potentials and transformation. This creative practice is person-centered, engagement-oriented and process-focused. The workshop is designed for any helping professional who is interested in exploring the power of arts to advance their professional practice and pursuing expressive arts as a professional path. Participants will have opportunity to experiment the use of arts for creative self-awareness so that they can synthesize their hands-on experience with conceptual learning.

- Understand the evolving principles of using arts for trauma and recovery;
- Develop a person-centered being, skills and sensitivity for applying multi-modal of expressive arts in clinical practice with cultural and ethical consideration;
- Understand the person-centered expressive arts process in understanding and healing trauma.

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TRAINER

Dr. Fiona Chang is a Registered Social Worker and a Registered Expressive Arts Therapist with the International Expressive Arts Therapy Association (IEATA). She is currently the Vice-chairperson of "Art in Hospital", the Founding President of the Expressive Arts Therapy Association of Hong Kong, a part-lecturer of the social work departments of The University of Hong Kong and The Chinese University of Hong Kong, the advisor of the "Art Therapy Without Borders" and the South Western College in Santa Fe. She was the former Executive Co-chair and board member of IEATA. She pioneered the Patient Resource Centre in public hospitals. She received the H.K. International Cancer Congress Young Investigators' Award, Outstanding Staff Award of Hospital Authority, Distinguished Social Work Alumni of HKU and the Shining Star Award of IEATA.

She initiated expressive arts project with Orphans with HIV in Cambodia, a Wellness CD project for cancer patients and hosted the IEATA Conference in Hong Kong in 2015. She wrote several chapters on expressive arts therapy for internationally and locally published books, including "The Creative Connection for Groups: Person-centered Expressive Arts for Healing & Social Change", "Art Therapy in Asia: To the bone or Wrapped in Silk", "Art Therapy and Health Care", "Mindfulness and the arts therapies", "Psychosocial Oncology and Palliative Care in Hong Kong: The first decade" and "Group Case book" (千帆並舉 - 社會工作小組新貎 in Chinese). Her Chinese book "Expression · Arts · Therapy" (表達 · 藝術 · 治療 in Chinese) was published in 2015.
