

Healing the Shattered Temenos: Trauma and the Expressive Arts

Introduction

This course will introduce participants to the experience of trauma and how to address it as an expressive arts therapist. The Chinese character for crisis is a combination of two words – danger and opportunity. People who fully engage in recovery from trauma discover unexpected benefits. As they gradually heal their wounds, survivors find that they are also developing inner strength, compassion for others, increasing self-awareness, and often the most surprising – a greater ability to experience joy and serenity than ever before.

Psychological trauma is the unique individual experience of an event or enduring conditions, in which:

- ♦ The individual's ability to integrate his/her emotional experience is overwhelmed, or
- ♦ The individual experiences (subjectively) a threat to life, bodily integrity, or sanity.

Thus, a traumatic event or situation creates psychological trauma when it overwhelms the individual's ability to cope, and leaves that person fearing death, annihilation, mutilation, or psychosis. The individual may feel emotionally, cognitively, and physically overwhelmed. The circumstances of the event commonly include abuse of power, betrayal of trust, entrapment, helplessness, pain, confusion, and/or loss.

This course will introduce participants to the traditional definition and theory of trauma, brain research in relationship to trauma, the stages of trauma and indigenous healing practices that address trauma, i.e. expressive arts therapy. In addition, we will explore the Jungian understanding of trauma and how it interlaces with expressive. The course will include an intuitive and didactic understanding of these aspects through readings, arts and written assignments and multi-arts processes. Participants will also be introduced to art as healing from an indigenous perspective including discussion of traditional symbolic cross-cultural healing practices and concepts of healing and wellness; the origins of the arts as a diagnostic tool from traditional perspectives, complexes as a healing function and the use of multi-arts processes to address the healing of developmental, traumatic and cultural trauma.

Target participants

Social workers, counsellors, psychologists, psychiatrists, expressive arts therapists, arts therapists, health care professionals and expressive arts therapy students.

Dr. Kate T. DONOHUE is a licensed psychologist and registered expressive art therapist with a Ph.D. in Counselling Psychology. Kate has a deep passion for the arts, culture and dance, especially western African dance. Her life work in teaching supervision, consultation, training and private has been to marry Jungian theory with expressive arts therapy.

For over 30 years, Kate had an active private practice in San Francisco and is now in Fort Bragg, California as well as being an international trainer, author and pioneer in the field of expressive arts therapy. Currently, Kate has been conducting workshops which weaves her passions, training and experience, to explore the indigenous roots of expressive arts therapy in Ghana and India.
