Course Description



Expressive Arts Therapy is a creative blending of expressive arts and psychotherapy. It is an integrated use of multimodal discipline of arts as a form of therapy to enhance personal growth. People can connect with their body, emotion, thoughts and spirits through the creative healing process. Maskmaking is a popular means in expressive arts. Mask serves the function of symbolizing our persona, our ability to change and to transform. It empowers us to reveal what has been hidden and brings to see our true selves.

Mindfulness and Person-centered Expressive Arts share similar thoughts of the moment to moment awareness of our present experience without judgment. Their combined effort in mask exploration can deepen self-understanding. When we are mindful in focusing on the expressive arts process for self-exploration, we can truly be open to the creative exploratory process and fully present to what we are thinking, experiencing, feeling and doing at any moment. Mask is a safe and well-contained tool for personal transformation.

In this workshop, each individual participates fully in the process through creating, meditating, doing, observing, feeling and saying in a mindful way. Participants can gain first-hand experience on the systematic steps of facilitation and learn the integrated methods of using expressive arts and mindfulness in practice. Listening, compassion and positive regards are also stimulated when seeing and touching the mask.

Trainer

Fiona is a Registered Expressive Arts Therapist with the International Expressive Arts Therapy Association - IE-ATA and a Registered Social Worker. She became accomplished at Person-centered Expressive Arts Approach with the founder Dr. Natalie Rogers at Saybrook University in the U.S.A.. She has been integrating multimodal expressive arts processes in a variety of groups for nearly 25 years. She was the Founder/Program Director of the Three-year Expressive Arts Therapy Training Program of the Centre on Behavioral Health of the University of Hong Kong. She wrote several chapters on expressive arts therapy for internationally and locally published books.



She is the Vice-chairperson of "Art in Hospital", the Founding President of the Expressive Arts Therapy Association of Hong Kong - EATA HK, an advisor of the "Art Therapy Without Borders", an advisor of the South Western College in Santa Fe and the past Executive Cochair of IEATA. She was the Pioneer of the Patient Resource Centre in public hospitals. She received many awards, including Hong Kong International Cancer Congress Young Investigators' Award, Outstanding Staff of Hospital Authority and Distinguished Social Work Alumni. She is an international trainer, amateur artist, unpaid photographer and full-time mother.
