Social work for kindergarten series – Course I

About the series

Professional social work service for children has been in increasing demand in recent years with the raise of attention to child welfare, child protection and child special needs. Social work service for children is expanding from primary and secondary school settings to kindergarten setting and is calling for specialized training in kindergarten social work.

Working in kindergarten setting could be challenging for the social work practitioners and helping professionals. Kindergarten setting denotes working with children at pre-school age and families with launching children. It serves as a basic and crucial institution for developing the children and supporting families with stresses and challenges. It represents a multi-disciplinary collaboration between children, families, teaching professionals, school personnel, and social workers from different fields in community.


Social work practitioners and helping professionals need to develop working knowledge of theory in family approach, childcare and child protection, skills and capacities in resolving problems and family crisis. They require specialised knowledge and skill set to provide service up to standard and expectation.

A series of training in social work for kindergarten will be provided by Division of Professional Continuing Education (CPE) to match the training need in this area. The series is to equip helping professionals who are working or interested in working in kindergarten setting with essential and fundamental knowledge and skills in working with children and their family.

Course I covers a wide range of topics to enable participants to effectively conceptualize children's needs and problems, address the issues from various systemic levels, including individual, family, small groups, and sometimes larger community. Participants will also be enriched with the systemic perspective, family-centred intervention, as well as strength perspective.
