WHAT IS NDI?

Narrative Drawing Intervention (NDI) is a brand new clinical psychotherapeutic model that combines two effective psychotherapeutic interventions – Narrative Intervention and Art Therapy. This model is developed by Clinical Psychologist, Certified Trauma Specialist and Registered Art Therapist, Dr. Monica Wong, through a decade of clinical practice and intensive research.

WHERE IS NDI USED?

The broad application of NDI includes: trauma relief, improvement of psychological wellbeing, facilitation of emotional self-regulation, strengthening of interpersonal relationships, personal growth, prevention of psychological turbulences and enhancement of mental health.

STYLE OF LEARNING

Theory, experiential learning, live demonstration, hands-on practice.

COURSE CONTENT

- Acquiring knowledge about the probable meanings of symbols in drawings
- Introduction to application of drawing in different therapeutic context
- Techniques and guidelines in establishing therapeutic relationships, performing goal settings and engaging in therapeutic conversations

- How to pinpoint important messages from client's narratives and address their needs

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BRIEF RATIONALE BEHIND

NDI combines the use of drawings and the narratives that clients give about the drawings, in order to bring unconscious feelings and beliefs into conscious.

The first step of a typical NDI session involves goal setting, establishing of therapeutic relationships and engaging in therapeutic conversations. Through narratives of the story behind client's drawings, intrinsic meaning of 'subconscious symbols' can be externalized to a conscious level, which grants helping professionals the opportunity to observe and understand the inner self of clients. When clients are able to understand themselves, they can start to accept themselves and to finally play out their potentials to fullest. As such, we aim to draw out inner strengths and core values of clients, explore their external resources and support systems and ultimately to increase self-acceptance and resilience, in order to replace unconscious defense mechanism with positive conscious coping strategies, where self-confidence and hopes of the clients can be harvested.

TRAINER'S BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Monica Wong, PsyD. (黃曉紅) is an author, clinical psychologist, registered art therapist, regional representative of Asia for the Australian Creative Arts Therapies Association, the first trauma therapist and trainer in Asia certified by the National Institute for Trauma and Loss in Children (USA), founder of the Psycho-Art Therapy Association, advisor of the Eugene Group, academic director of the Hong Kong Institute for Counseling Professionals and the Psycho-Adventure Training Center, and founder of the Society for Junior Writers of Hong Kong. Dr. Wong has been a professional trainer delivering courses on NDI (formerly known as Projective Drawing), Enneagram, and Storytelling for the CUHK regularly since 2006. Besides, she is often invited to conduct seminars and workshops for universities and colleges, secondary and primary schools, hospitals, governmental departments, enterprises and non-profit organizations.

Graduated from Philosophy in CUHK, Dr. Wong has performed attentive research in psychology and psychotherapies in recent years and obtained her master's degree in counselling from Monash University in Australia and her doctoral degree in clinical psychology from California School of Professional Psychology, AIU (USA). She has been to Australia to follow the world-class psychotherapy master, Mr. Michael White for studying Narrative Therapy. She has been supervised by internationally renowned art therapy masters Dr. Cathy Malchiodi and Ms. Cornelia Elbrecht in Art Therapy. She is one of the authors and hosts of Stories from Afar (尋找他鄉的故事) and Success Stories Series (傑出華人系列), both large-scale televised documentaries. She is also the co-author of best-seller books, Open the Locks of the Hearts – Enneagram (打開心鎖的密碼—九型人格心理學), Draw the Feelings out from Your Heart - Projective Drawing (畫出心中情), and the author of Walking Through the Ruin of the Hearts - Case study of Projective Drawing and Narrative Therapy (走出心靈的廢墟—投射繪畫與敘事治療實錄) and Happiness Is Around the Corner of Life (快樂在生命轉彎處). She has newly developed her own clinical model: Narrative Drawing Intervention (NDI) and presented it in a number of international conferences, universities and hospitals in the United States of America, Australia, Mexico, Singapore, the mainland China, Hong Kong and Macau. More than ten thousand of helping professionals have been trained over the decade. Dr. Wong has led 14 volunteer teams to earthquake-hit areas in Sichuan since 2008, and has been leading another helping professional team to provide psychotherapies to school teachers and students who are under great pressure in Hong Kong since 2015. She has also hosted an international conference on art therapy in China in 2013 and another one in Hong Kong in 2016.
