Three-day Workshop on Arts-inspired Group Work Practice

Course Description

This course combines the theoretical foundation of expressive arts for group development, basic working principles of applying arts in local group work practice and practical tips in using arts in groups. It is a practice-based professional training of applying multimodal expressive arts to enhance individual and group development. The course is designed for any helping professional who is interested in applying arts in their group work practice and pursuing the expressive arts as a professional path.

Expressive arts is naturally a creative tool for expression, communication, empowerment and therapeutic healing. This creative practice is person-centered, engagement-oriented and process-focused. Participants will have the opportunity to experience the use of arts for collective awareness, so that they can synthesize their hands-on experience with conceptual learning.

Trainer

Fiona is a Registered Expressive Arts Therapist with the International Expressive Arts Therapy Association - IEATA and a Registered Social Worker. She became accomplished at Personcentered Expressive Arts Approach with the founder Dr. Natalie Rogers at Saybrook University in the U.S.A.. She has been integrating multimodal expressive arts processes in a variety of groups for nearly 25 years. She was the Founder/Program Director of the Three-year Expressive Arts Therapy Training Program of the Centre on Behavioral Health of the University of Hong Kong. She wrote several chapters on expressive arts therapy for internationally and locally published books.



She is the Vice-chairperson of "Art in Hospital", the Founding President of the Expressive Arts Therapy Association of Hong Kong - EATA HK, an advisor of the "Art Therapy Without Borders" and the South Western College in Santa Fe. She was the past Executive Co-chair of IEATA and a Pioneer of the Patient Resource Centre in public hospitals. She received many awards, including Hong Kong International Cancer Congress Young Investigators' Award, Outstanding Staff of Hospital Authority, HKU Distinguished Social Work Alumni and the IEATA Shining Star Award. She is an international trainer, amateur artist, unpaid photographer and full-time mother.
