

Child maltreatment is a family crisis where children and families are experiencing traumatic experiences, pains and sufferings. Beyond this trajected experience, families are facing unhappiness, difficulties and challenges in their life cycle. Difficulties of individual family member would affect other family members and vice versa. The healing journey can be activated from uncovering the incident of child maltreatment and go farther to a systemic intervention for the family as a whole.

The objective of this workshop is to take a wholistic and systemic perspective on the family experienced child maltreatment and move beyond the child maltreatment incident for a healing process of family. The workshop would empower the helping professionals to identify and address the potential risk of child abuse, make initial assessment and intervention. It promotes the family-based interventions to heal those families experienced child maltreatment and mitigate the family challenges and difficulties.

### Content

- Identification and initial assessment on suspected child maltreatment
- Family-based intervention for families experiencing child maltreatment incident
- Supervision on family-based intervention with child maltreatment incident and adverse childhood experiences


