

Intensive Training in Child-Centered Play Therapy

Description

Child-Centered Play Therapy (CCPT) is a nondirective play therapy approach for children who have emotional and behavioral difficulties. The efficacy of CCPT for children has been well established by research over many years. This training also serves as a foundation for preparing practitioners in understanding and applying Filial Therapy to work with parents.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Describe in practical terms what is meant by each of Axline's 8 principles of CCPT
- Compare and contrast the methods of nondirective play therapy with other directive approaches
- Describe CCPT based on Guerney's model
- Conduct the 4 primary skills of CCPT
- Handle a wide range of possible situations in play therapy
- Involve parents in meaningful ways in the play therapy process
- Immediately and confidently use CCPT in their work with children
