

two day workshop on *Martaliae* FAMILY THERAPY

Narrative therapy is developed by Michael White and David Epston in the 1990s. Coming out of the experience of family therapy, it expands the scope from families to other significant contexts of the persons. It enables us to visualize the relationships of the problem-saturated story, the relational practices of family members, and their negative identities. Problems often lead family members to take a single-storied view of their plight that create conditions for provocative effects of self and relational practices, such as blame and guilt. These practices pit family members against themselves and each other and can lead to negative identity conclusions.

A systemic perspective focuses on the relationships and connections that are embedded in specific social, political, and cultural contexts. Sharing the strong relational perspective of systemic perspective, narrative practice addresses the relationships of persons with problems and the dominant ideologies and social discourses. This training course focuses on the application of narrative therapy in working with families and its dialogue with the systemic perspective. Brief content of the workshop are as follows:

- Introduction of Narrative Therapy as a Family Therapy approach
- Basic concepts and worldview
- Application of Narrative Family Therapy
- Cases sharing

Dr LAU is an experienced trainer and clinical supervisor in family social work practice.
