What is NDI[®]?

Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] (NDI[®]) is a clinical psychotherapeutic model which merges organically two effective psychotherapeutic interventions – Narrative Therapy and Art Therapy. This model was developed in 2015 by Dr. Monica Wong, Clinical Psychologist, Certified Trauma Specialist and Registered Art Therapist, through a decade of clinical practice and intensive research.

Where is NDI[®] used?

The broad application of NDI[®] includes: trauma relief, improvement of psychological wellbeing, facilitation of emotional self-regulation, strengthening of interpersonal relationships, personal growth, prevention of psychological turbulences and

What to expect

- How to read and understand the "maps" (different people's drawings) of their inner world.
- How to define and establish therapeutic relationships with clients
- How to pinpoint important messages from client's narratives and address their needs
- How to start engaging in therapeutic conversations with clients
- The importance of goal setting in an NDI[®] session

Brief Rationale Behind

NDI[®] merges organically the concepts of art therapy and the narratives that clients give about their drawings, as well as the therapeutic conversations between the client and therapist, in order to bring unconscious feelings and thoughts into conscious expressions. Once the unconscious becomes conscious, in one's life, more choice will become possible. Hence, the problem-saturated story can be deconstructed and the preferred story can be reconstructed.

Style of learning

Theory, experiential learning, live demonstration, hands-on practice.

Course content

- Acquiring knowledge about the probable meanings of symbols in drawings
- Introduction to application of drawing in different therapeutic context
- Techniques and guidelines in establishing therapeutic relationships, emphasising on the importance of the "do no harm" principle and engaging in the process of NDI[®] - "3 treasures", "3 drawings" and "3 journeys"

Target Participants

Psychologists, social workers, psychiatrists and staff in mental health services, counsellors, therapists, teachers, trainers, parents and individuals who are interested in psychology



The first step of a typical NDI[®] session involves goal setting, establishing of therapeutic relationships and engaging in therapeutic conversations. Through narratives of the story behind client's drawings, intrinsic meaning of 'subconscious symbols' can be externalized to a conscious level, which grants helping professionals the opportunity to observe and understand the inner self of clients. When clients are able to understand themselves, they can start to accept themselves and to finally play out their potentials to the fullest. As such, we aim to draw out inner strengths and core values of clients, explore their external resources and support systems and ultimately to increase self-acceptance and resilience, in order to replace unconscious defense mechanism with conscious positive coping strategies, where self-confidence and hopes of the clients can be harvested.

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Trainer's Biography

Dr. Monica Wong, PsyD (黃曉紅博士) is an author, clinical psychologist, registered art therapist, founder of Narrative Drawing Intervention[®], the first Trauma Specialist and Trainer in Asia certified by The National Institute for Trauma and Loss in Children, Professional Member of the ANZACATA, Certified Expressive Art Therapy Consultant in The United States, Academic Director of Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] Institute, Chairperson of the Psycho-Art Therapy Association, Founder of the "By Your Side" psychological support program, Chairperson of the four International Conferences on Art Therapy in 2013-2023, as well as The 9th Anniversary of Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] 2024 International Conference & Festival of Expressive Arts Therapy.

Dr. Wong studied Narrative Therapy with psychotherapy master Michael White, and art therapy with famous art therapists Dr. Cathy Malchiodi and Cornelia Elbrecht. She has been a guest lecturer of the Chinese University of Hong Kong since 2006, regular workshops conducted include: Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] (Foundation, Practicum and Supervision courses) and The Use of NDI[®] x Storytelling in Counselling and Conducting Therapeutic Groups, which were all full-house popular courses. Besides, she is often invited to conduct seminars and workshops for universities and colleges, secondary and primary schools, hospitals, government departments, enterprises and non-profit organizations.

Graduated from Philosophy in CUHK, Dr. Wong has performed attentive research in psychology and psychotherapies in recent years and obtained her master's degree in counselling from Monash University in Australia and her master's and doctoral degrees in clinical psychology from California School of Professional Psychology, AIU (USA).

In the past decades, Dr. Wong has been developing and fine-tuning her own clinical model: Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] (NDI[®]) and presented it in numerous international conferences, universities and hospitals in United States, Australia, Mexico, Singapore, India, Nepal, Indonesia, Mongolia, Hong Kong, Macau and mainland China. More than ten thousand helping professionals have been trained in the past decades.

Since 2008, Dr. Wong has led 18 volunteer teams to provide psychological support to victims of earthquakes in Sichuan, as well as trauma victims of natural disasters, deprivation and human trafficking in Indonesia, India and Nepal, and has been leading another helping professional team to provide psychotherapies to school teachers and students who were under great pressure in Hong Kong since 2015. She has also hosted four charitable International Conferences on Art Therapy in 2013-2023, to continue to promote cultural and academic exchange in the field of art therapy with an international perspective. Scholars and clinicians from over 20 countries were invited to Hong Kong, Beijing and Shenzhen to share their abundant knowledge, theories, experiences and research findings with Chinese helping professionals.

In March 2024, Dr. Wong and Professor Zhu Yanguang co-convened and initiated the "Harmony – Peace Angels Global Project" which is jointly organised by Psycho-Art Therapy Association and Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] International Society. Through conducting collaborative art activities, we can send our love and blessings to children who are suffering from war and allow participants to see their inner strengths in their creations, find external resources that exist among each other, and hope that comes from the heart. More importantly, this project brings invaluable life education to children and adolescents who are living in peace.

In May 2024, Dr. Wong has presented the findings of NDI[®] research at the 35th Annual Boston International Trauma Conference and given workshops to graduate students at Lesley University in Boston, United States and the Central Academy of Fine Arts in China.

In October 2024, the Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] Institute, Sichuan University, the Central Academy of Fine Arts, the Expressive Arts Branch of the Chinese Population Culture Promotion Association, etc. jointly organised the "I See You - the 9th Anniversary of Narrative Drawing Intervention[®] International Conference & 2024 Festival of Expressive Arts Therapy.

Dr. Wong served as the chairperson of the above conference which has included 38 keynote speeches, presentations and workshops, showcasing the latest theoretical and practical advances in expressive arts therapy and Narrative Drawing Intervention[®], and has attracted more than 10,000 participants from all over the world. Dr. Wong was subsequently invited by the Central Academy of Fine Arts to serve as the academic moderator of the "Special Theme" section at the 2024 Art Therapists Conference.
