#### **RESEARCH FOCUS**

My research focuses on children, adolescents, and interpersonal violence, with a particular emphasis on three themes: school violence and bullying, child and adolescent well-being, and socially vulnerable and oppressed children and adolescents. I have explored these three themes in diverse contexts, from Chinese societies (Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Mainland) to global contexts, from social work to interdisciplinary collaboration and integration, and from majority to socially vulnerable children.
